### Important Considerations

**Work Colleges:** Students work on campus to cover tuition costs. Typically 10-15 hours per week.

**Military Academies:** Require military service commitment after graduation. Highly competitive admission.

**Specialized Programs:** May have specific requirements such as demonstrated financial need, geographic restrictions, or talent-based admission.
